

A number of concerning issues were brought to my attention in the last month, including the lack of funding for youth music for groups (such as South Powys Music, who regularly meet in Brecon) and the end of the Abergweswyn to Builth Wells Post Bus Service, both which I have raised with the National Assembly for Wales and Powys County Council. The loss of funding for such initiatives will, I believe, have a detrimental impact for my constituents.

I have visited the Assembly on a number of occasions this month - I met and spoke with students from Ffynnon Gynydd Primary School on their visit to the Assembly, and spoke on the Annual Report of the Committee of Standards of Conduct, a committee which I chair in the Assembly. I also attended a plenary session and helped defeat the Government's plans by voting against the introduction a new system for compensating farmers for dead cattle, which would not have differentiated between ordinary animals and pedigree breeds.
